Taylor City-Wide Cleanup, Taylor Community Cleanup Slated for Oct. 17

TAYLOR, Texas – The City of Taylor will be sponsoring a City-Wide cleanup day on October 17, 2015 and will be launching the First Taylor Community Cleanup in the Burkett St. neighborhood from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. the same day.

The Burkett St. area in Taylor was selected as our first community cleanup site. The neighborhoods from Burkett St. to Lenora Dr., encompassing Davidson Dr. and Sabrina Dr., will participate in our Taylor Community Cleanup event.

This event will bring together neighbors and community members in partnership to focus on beautification efforts within Taylor and their surrounding areas.

“We’re very excited about this new partnership focused effort in our city,” said Jesse Ancira, Jr., Mayor of Taylor. “With the recent road improvements throughout the Taylor Community, this cleanup effort will help highlight the City’s natural beauty and will bring neighbors and citizens together for a common cause.”

The community cleanup will involve local residents, volunteers from civic groups and churches, City staff and businesses who are available to help on October 17. A hot dog barbecue will be held at the conclusion of the event to celebrate the new partnership and hard work of all involved.

The City Council and staff are committed to uniting with Taylor residents to keep our neighborhoods clean and safe. Projects such as this help to address those issues and build upon a partnership model for our City.

Through the partnership model, citizens and local government work together building solid relationships that help to solve problems like crime, homelessness, city cleanliness and pride, and failing schools.

For the City-Wide Cleanup, the following places will be designated as drop off locations for debris:

Community members will need to bring proof of residency, with either a valid driver’s license or utility bill, to the drop off location. This service is being provided free of charge to Taylor residents.
