Call to order and declare a quorum

The meeting was called to order and quorum declared at 5:30 P.M.

Approve the minutes from September 20, 2022

Minutes for September 20, 2022 were approved as presented.

Follow-up on Veterans Day event

Good crowd, good speaker, Daughters of the American Revolution chapter from Georgetown provided snacks and helped serve. Their assistance was greatly appreciated. DAR member later sent us iris rhizomes for planting in the garden. DAR group recognized a DAR pin in the upstairs display cabinet. They researched it and found that Miss Mary Robertson Moody was a member of the DAR.

Follow-up on dedication ceremony for the Dan'l Moody Plaque

It was a good idea to combine it with the Salute to Veterans.

Discuss Christmas time at the Moody

Volunteer will meet to decorate Dec. 6 at 5 p.m.

There will not be a children's event this year due to a lack of someone to host it.

Discuss Historical Commission Program

Mrs. Brackenridge said the annual program to be held in the courtroom where the Klan trial took place will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Klan trial. The speaker will be Patricia Bernstein author of "\$10 to Hate." The event will be held in February and tickets are \$15 per person. A maximum of 200 people can attend. The details for ticket sales are still being decided.

Ms. Pierce mentioned that her aunt and uncle testified against the Klan members at the trial.

The Palace Theater is going to revive the Dan Moody play in the fall and the Williamson Museum will do a display on Moody and the trial.

Report from the Friends of the Moody Museum

Mr. Burgess said that the Salute to Veterans brought together multiple groups and was an excellent day for the museum. The Friends will have 20 copies of the Historical Commission's 2023 calendar for sale at the Moody. They will sell for \$15 each.

Mr. Burgess said he Nancci and Frances Sorrow proposed a historical preservation ordinance, but it died. The City staff is now developing an ordinance. Joe suggested we have the city explain their preservation effort to the Board so we can decide if it is something we can support.

Receive update on the Louis K. Ned Fund & the Nancy Moody bequest

Susan shared the report from Carrie. The wallpaper has been ordered. The city is working to get cameras for the front and back of the building. It was discussed whether HOT (hotel/motel tax) funds could be used toward construction of the statue.

Moody Updates

The museum will be open both Saturday and Sunday afternoons from 2-5 p.m. during the Historical Society's Christmas tour of homes. Since the museum was not included in the original publicity, we will prepare flyers to leave at the various locations including St. James Episcopal Church.
