Taylor Police Department:

- ***Serving Our Seniors (S.O.S.) Program***
 - Free service that only requires participants to have a telephone
 - Calls are made daily at pre-arranged times – if an issue is noted by dispatch, they will send a PD officer to the location

- ***Neighborhood Watch***
 - Program designed to prevent crime by reporting suspicious activity in your neighborhood
